

# The "IF" Plan

## Remote / Online Learning 2021/22

"IF" we run out of staff due to quarantines or isolations, and/or the supply chain breaks down (food, bus parts, toilet paper, etc...), Clear Fork Valley will have to look at other options for the education of our students. We want parents to be informed and have contingency plans ready.



### Remote / Online Plan 10,000 Foot View

- Pre-K through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students will report to school every day. We will provide busing for them as if it was a normal day. Pickup and drop off times to your child's home will change because of fewer students on the buses.
- Special education students in grades 4 through 12, who are unable to learn via Zoom, will report every day as determined by their intervention specialist. Students will be in pods with their intervention specialist teacher.
- Grades 4 through 12's time schedule will be the same as a normal school day. Every student will receive restroom breaks and lunch times built in to the online school day. Teachers will determine when breaks occur. Lunches should occur at regular lunch times as though the students were at school.
- Jetpacks will be available for students without internet at home, just like last year.
- If a Pre-K through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade or special education teacher is absent, a substitute will be in the room while the teacher teaches from home by Zooming into the classroom LIVE.
- Breakfast and lunch will be available during the school day for the students who are in person with some adjustments dealing with time. Students on remote will have the ability to pick up meals like last year. Families will have to register for them.
- Extracurriculars will run like normal, before and after school hours.
- If Knox County Career Center or other non-public schools are in session we will continue transportation for the students.

**Remote / online periods maybe as short as one day or as long as a month or more. We will return to full in person instruction as soon as we have enough staffing and/or supplies.**

### Things to Think About

There could be little warning before moving to this plan because the school or district may not know what staff is out and whether substitutes are available until the morning of the school day.

- ✓ Do I have childcare setup?
- ✓ Do I have a device my child can use to connect? Did my child bring their Chromebook home?
- ✓ Is my internet working? Do I need a jetpack?
- ✓ Does my child know how to login?
- ✓ Has the teacher provided login information?
- ✓ Do I understand attendance policies?
- ✓ How do I get my child to and from extracurricular activities?
