Our kindergarten classes sang the National Anthem and American Soldier. Mr. Black led our third graders with two musical selections, "America, The Beautiful" and "Our Heroes Will Live On." Third grade students concluded their portion of the program by reciting the American Creed.



Thirty five Veterans were recognized and stayed for coffee and doughnuts after the program. They also received personal thank you notes created by our students.

Whitney Bates had her 8th grade students work on constructing airplanes, boats, and other structures related to branches of the Military.










Mrs. Campbell's 6th grade class read a story about Sgt. Stubby the Dog








The Rubber Ducky Story


